A Letter from the Township Manager

It's hard to believe that we are already talking about the 2021-2022 winter season, but no matter how we feel about the season, it will be here very soon. So, as township staff prepares for the fun stuff, like Moon Lights, ice skating, and sled riding at Moon Park, we also must prepare for the cold weather and snowfall. Park hours will soon be running on the "dawn to dusk" schedule, picnic benches will be moved inside of pavilions, and restrooms will be closed until spring. Soon you will see public works vehicles equipped with plows and salt boxes so when that snow arrives they are ready to clear a path.

While we get ready for all of that, the Moon Beautification 101 campaign will continue. Some of the programs that are offered to residents are the result of the work of a very active Environmental Advisory Committee, which is made up of seven township residents. These residents, who are appointed by the Board of Supervisors, volunteer their time to plan events throughout the year which are intended to help Moon become a more environmentally friendly community. Through this committee and staff member Lora Dombrowski, the following programs were offered to the resident in 2021:

- Annual Recycling Day, to help keep reusable items out of landfills, for example, usable construction materials, household appliances, electronics, tires, and some medical supplies
- Electronics collection days to gather unused and unwanted electronic items such as printers, copiers, computers, laptops, and televisions
- Stream bank clean-up along Montour Run and Flaugherty Run
- Stormwater education and outreach
- PRC's Traveling Glass Recycling bin in partnership with MTMA
- Park and road cleanup

Another program that allows most Moon Township residents to dispose of household materials easily and safely is the "At Your Door Special Collection" program. This program is available all year long. If you are not familiar with the program, please contact MTMA for more details.

Why am I sharing all this information with you? Because as a government entity with an outstanding partnership with the MTMA, I believe we do a terrific job providing multiple options to recycle and properly dispose of unwanted items. These efforts keep waste off the sides of the roadways or in residents' yards. After my last article, I am happy to report that I received several telephone calls with suggestions and concerns of how much trash people toss out the windows of their cars or over a hillside.

If I asked what you believe the number one item is that Public Works crews pick up alongside roadways and throughout the Township for our annual recycling day collection, what would be your guess? I will give you a little hint, this item takes approximately 50-80 years to break down in a land fill. You can find a picture featuring this item in the June 2021 Monthly Newsletter which can be found online at moontwp.us.

So, as we move from fall to winter and then to spring, please know that the staff and volunteers in Moon are planning for the 2022 events, but without your commitment to assisting in keeping Moon litter-free, it will be difficult. Moon is a wonderful community, with many programs for the residents, so please reach out if you have questions, or need some assistance. But most of all, please do your part to keep the roadways and greenways clear of litter and debris and continue our efforts so people want to "Make it Moon," to live, to learn, to work, and to play.

Christmas Tree Pickup

The Public Works Department will offer curbside Christmas tree pickup for live trees only from December 27 through January 10. Residents are asked to place trees at the curb by 8 AM following their regular garbage schedule. All ornaments and decorations must be removed. Artificial trees are not accepted.

Compost Drop-off and Pickup

Residents may drop off yard waste to be composted including tree limbs, leaves, and plant matter. Please use biodegradable bags. Tree limbs should not exceed six feet in length and four inches in diameter and should not be bundled or tied. Residents are reminded that drop-off is for yard waste only. Trash or other materials are not permitted. The composting program provides free mulch and compost to residents. Bring your containers and take as much as you need. The drop-off location is at the Public Works facility at Moon Park. Please notify Public Works before your arrival by calling **412.262.1700**.

Winter Plowing Rundown

The Public Works snow removal fleet includes 19 trucks and 1 sidewalk crew for the 2021-2022 season. To tackle snow and ice removal, Moon Township Public Works divides the town into 19 snow routes, covering approximately 173 miles Township Roads, 23 lane miles of State Roads and 8 lane miles of County Roads. The department's road clearing schedule goes off of priority. First, primary roads and bus routes are cleared. Then secondary roads and state and county roads are plowed, followed by subdivisions and cul-de-sacs. In addition to clearing Township roads, crews help to maintain Township facility parking lots.

Public Works coordinates with Moon Police and Moon Area School District to ensure public safety throughout the winter months. Moon Township Police Department monitors all road conditions during their routes and notifies the Public Works Departments of any late-night call-outs. The Public Works Operation Manager is in contact with the school superintendent for school delays, early dismissals, and ever-changing road conditions due to inclement weather.

As the Public Works Department prepares for the winter season, residents should be prepared too! Here are some tips for the upcoming winter season:

- Help snowplow drivers by staying 100 feet (5 car lengths) back so the driver can see you.
- Do not park on Township roads between 2 AM and 6 AM.
- Do not plow or shovel snow from driveways, parking lots, or sidewalks into the streets.
- To help reduce the amount of snow pushed by plows back into your driveway, pile snow near the road on the right side of the driveway.
- Place garbage and recycling containers back in the driveway entrance to avoid spilling. Questions about garbage collection should be directed to the Moon Township Municipal Authority at **412.264.4300**.
- Residents with sidewalks are required to clear the sidewalks of snow.
- Remove any portable basketball hoops, hockey nets, or any other obstruction from public roadways and cul-de-sacs.

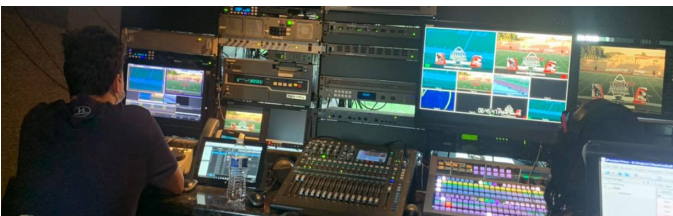

Stormwater Pollution

Do Your Part. One Drop at a Time



What is Stormwater Pollution

When it rains, some of the rainwater soaks into the ground, and part of it flows over the ground and directly into creeks, streams, or rivers. This water that runs off into the river is called runoff, or sometimes stormwater runoff. Clever, huh? Sometimes this stormwater runoff gets polluted. Pollution is anything that harms natural resources, whether it is air, soil, or in this case, water. Sometimes the pollution is something you can see, like trash floating on top of the water. Other times you can't see the pollution at all, like when motor oil from a car washes into a nearby creek. Polluted runoff is the number one cause of water pollution in the United States. So, who is to blame? Who is making the water that we drink and swim in dirty? We all are... do your part, one drop at a time.

Why is Stormwater Pollution a Concern

It is of concern for two main issues: one related to the volume and timing of runoff water and the other related to potential contaminants that the water is carrying from human and animal activities. These contaminants are picked up as water from a storm or garden hoses and sprinklers drain from streets, parking lots, and lawns and enter the system through our catch basins and storm drains. From there, they are transferred straight to rivers and streams untreated.

Anything that is dumped or dropped on the ground or in the gutter contributes to stormwater pollution. Much of it is not biodegradable and is harmful to aquatic life and the cleanliness of the water that we swim in and drink.

Is there a difference between a storm drain and a sewer drain?

Yes! They are two completely separate drainage systems. The sewer system takes all household wastewater from toilets, showers, and sinks and routes it through your plumbing system, and directs it to a treatment plant.

The storm drain is intended to route rainwater quickly off the streets during a heavy storm. Unfortunately, it takes all the runoff along with it. Chemicals, trash, debris from lawns, parking lots, and streets, either intentionally or accidentally spilled, goes straight into our waterways.

Is Stormwater Treated Before it Reaches the River

No! Stormwater systems flow directly into the rivers and streams. The cost of treating stormwater would be so high it would exceed available resources.

The Effects of Pollution

Polluted stormwater runoff can have many adverse effects on plants, fish, animals, and people.

- Sediment can cloud the water and make it difficult or impossible for aquatic plants to grow. Sediment also can destroy aquatic habitats.
- Excess nutrients like fertilizer can cause algae blooms. When algae die, they sink to the bottom and decompose in a process that removes oxygen from the water. Fish and other aquatic organisms can't exist in water with low dissolved oxygen levels.
- Bacteria and other pathogens can wash into recreation areas and create health hazards, often making river advisories necessary.
- Debris – plastic bags, bottles, grass clippings/yard waste, and cigarette butts – washed into waterbodies can choke, suffocate, or disable aquatic life like ducks, fish, turtles, and birds.
- Household hazardous wastes like insecticides, pesticides, paint, solvents, used motor oil, and other auto fluids can poison aquatic life.
- Polluted stormwater often affects drinking water sources. This, in turn, can affect human health and increase drinking water treatment costs. For more information visit moontwp.com/departments/stormwater.php

New School Resource Officer at Moon Area School District

Moon Township Police in conjunction with Moon Area School District are glad to announce the school resource officer (SRO) is back. A School Resource Officer (SRO) is a sworn law enforcement officer who is dedicated to counseling, educating, and protecting the school and community. Moon Area School District's (MASD) school-based officer is a full-time member of the district during the school year.

Having an SRO on campus is an extension of the strong relationship between MASD and the Moon Township Police Department. The presence of an SRO on campus is an additional resource for students, staff, and families.

In 2016, former Chief McCarthy applied for and received a grant to put the first School Resource Officer in Moon Schools. Officer Zane was selected to be the SRO and forged the way in defining the position. In 2019, the SRO program was discontinued due to financial considerations and the pandemic. During that time, Officer Zane was promoted to Corporal and took on a new role within the police department.

This year, the school district approached Chief Seamon about reinstating the SRO. We are proud to announce Officer Beachy will be filling this position to help keep our schools safe. Officer Beachy will be the primary SRO with Officer Hale taking the position as the backup when needed.

Both officers completed the SRO training and Officer Beachy is scheduled to assume his full-time SRO position in the schools at the beginning of 2022. Officer Beachy and Officer Hale both started with Moon Township in 2018 and have taken initiative on many community-oriented duties such as Santa Cop, Child Safety Seat Technician training, and more.

Moon Area School District and the Moon Township Police Department share the same vision and goal for the safest learning environment for the students and staff. We believe Officer Beachy, with the help of Officer Hale, will continue to build on the foundation Corporal Zane started in the schools and continue to make the SRO position in the schools a positive force that will continue to help make the High School and Middle School safer places and foster positive relationships with students and staff.

Operation Santa Cop

Each year, Moon Township Police team up with Froggy Radio to collect toys for the kids in need in our community. Every child deserves to experience the joy and magic of Christmas and the cops are able to fulfill area children's wishes with their annual "Santa Cop" drive.

Thanks to the generous donations from customers, the Moon Township Santa Police deliver hundreds of gifts each year to area children in need. Partnering with Froggy FM Radio and Walmart, the Moon Township Police Department collects donations of toys and gift cards and delivers them to local kids.

The Santa Cop program connects cops with kids and provides those kids with a positive police interaction. Be sure to keep an eye out on Facebook for the 2021 collection date.

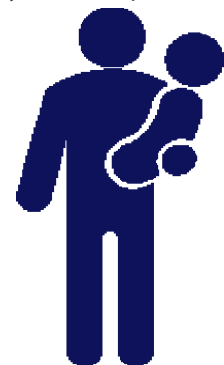

The list of recyclable material is as follows:

(1) Aluminum cans.

(2) Tin cans.

Do not recycle non-can items such as metal, foil, lawnmower blades, dog chains.

(3) Plastics – Clean bottles, jugs, jars only . No plastic bags. Do not put recycling materials in plastic bags.

#1 PET (Polyethylene Terephthalate): Clear containers typically used for soft drinks and bottled water.
No food trays.

#2 HDPE (High Density Polyethylene): Colored or translucent plastic. Typically used for milk or juice containers and common household chemicals, no plastic bags.

Plastics NOT RECYCLED

Types #3 through #7, bags, film wrap, black PET trays or food trays of any type, plastic items such as, but not limited to flower pots, vinyl siding, records, VCR tapes.

(4) Newspaper and Mixed Paper – Any clean paper that can be torn, copier paper, soft back books, colored paper, file folders, insides of hardback books, bar line paper, magazines, mail inserts, business cards, catalogues, telephone books, poster board, envelopes, greeting cards, chip board (cereal and other similar boxes must be flattened to reduce volume).

Do not recycle pizza boxes and other paper with food or grease contamination. These are disposed of with regular trash. Do not recycle shredded or small pieces of paper, nor plastic covered paper such as milk cartons or paper drink cups.

(5) Corrugated Cardboard – Must be flattened to reduce volume with large items to be placed beside or below the recycling bin. Flattened boxes larger than 48" must be cut into smaller pieces to allow loading. Do not put solid waste in cardboard boxes. Cardboard is to be recycled.

Other NOT RECYCLED

NO glass of any type. NO styrofoam. NO rubber products. These are disposed of with regular trash.

Materials Requiring Special Handling

Material:

Latex Paint

Carpet

Refrigerators & air conditioners

Construction debris, logs, large branches are not collected

Auto Parts & Tires ARE NOT COLLECTED

Disposal Method:

Dry up with kitty litter and dispose of with solid waste.

Secure in bundles less than 4 ft in length. Bundles must weigh less than 40 lbs.

Refrigerator door must be removed prior to pick-up. Freon must be removed by a licensed technician and a required sticker placed on unit.

Ask Your Smart Device About Moon Township *Say "MAKE IT MOON"!*

In case you missed it, Moon Township collaborated with Amazon Alexa and Google Assistant to bring voice activated e-gov to resident's households. This will allow users to download the skill of "Make it Moon" through their Google or Alexa app and then speak to their device to ask about events in Moon or report a problem.

This feature also allows users to find out when events are going on by asking questions such as "When is trick or treat?" or "What do I do with my tree limbs?" In addition, it can be used like the e-gov service offered online through the municipality to report problems and ask questions.
